Each module you listen to a CD recording of a natural English conversation and you do some exercises based on this recording. With your teacher you check your answers, discuss the vocabulary and grammar in the recording, and talk about the topics. There is further vocabulary development in the second half of each lesson with the chance to use the language in discussion with your teacher. There is also a key pronunciation point to study and practise. The target language you have studied is practised again in written homework and in a review stage at the beginning of the next lesson. You may also choose to study a grammar point each lesson: this is discussed when you enrol for the course and included in your programme if requested.

INTENSIVE-15 and INTENSIVE-20 courses (Levels 3 to 6): As above, you study one module of our General English coursebook per day, with extra lessons (1 or 2 per day) following your own personalised programme. There is further vocabulary development in the second half of each lesson with the chance to use the language in discussion with your teacher. There is also a key pronunciation point to study and practise. The target language you have studied is practised again in written homework and in a review stage at the beginning of the next lesson. You may also choose to study a grammar point each lesson: this will be discussed with you when you enrol for the course and included in your programme if requested.

Levels 1 and 2: You focus on building the basic skills of speaking, listening, pronunciation, reading, writing, grammar and vocabulary, following a published coursebook and with extra materials provided by the teacher.
